


CHURCH HALL UPDATE

Work continues to progress at a steady pace on our new hall. We have now reached what will appear to be 'slow progress' as very little will be happening to the exterior of the building while the major focus of work will be on the interior. Hopefully by the time you are reading this, a portion of the roof work will be completed and some of the windows will be fitted.



Internally, all the walls have been tracked for electrical sockets and switches and a lot of the 'behind the scenes' wiring has been completed. The structures for the suspended ceilings are in place and door frames are in situ ready to be fitted.

After a long and protracted period and amount of correspondence, it is hoped that we will soon be in a position to lay a new path from church to the hall across our ancient graveyard.

I would like at this stage of the build, to thank on your behalf a small band of people who have attended numerous meetings, held (and are still holding) discussions and continue to oversee on a day to day basis the work being undertaken. Without their diligence and cooperation none of this work would be taking place.

A sincere "thank

you" also to everyone who supported the fundraising initiatives. I'm currently preparing our 2018 accounts for independent inspection by our accountants and submission to the Charities Commission so come along to Easter Vestry and get the full low-down.

So, are you into resolution or revolution? We would certainly welcome your resolve to help continue building a parish where everyone can feel welcome, valued, appreciated and equally where everyone can add value.

Larne Inter Church Forum (formerly Larne Tuesday Group)

A luncheon celebrating the 25 years of Larne Tuesday Group, chaired by Rev Dr Ivan Hull, was held on Tuesday 15th January in the Curran Court Hotel, Larne. Speakers included Sister Margaret Rose one of the three founding sisters from Drumalis, Robert Alexander a laity founding member, Rev Andrew Kingston, past Chairman and former Larne Methodist Church minister all of whom reminisced about their experiences of LTG. The main speaker was the Very Revd. Stephen Forde, now Dean of St Anne's Cathedral, Belfast who gave an inspired talk about how he viewed the ecumenical role of the group over his 19 years as Rector in Larne. He quoted Jesus wish that "All be one" and said that we all should work together in a kaleidoscope of faith to glorify God, as the Tuesday Group had been striving to do for its 25 years.

The Group presented a cheque for £200 to "Black Santa" and later this year will present cheques to local charities. Meanwhile the Tuesday Group is in abeyance.



Video and virtual tour of St Cedma's Church



IN DR CONGO escalating violence is not stopping Mothers' Union working hard to look after local families and communities. Over the last 18 months has seen a rapid deterioration in the levels of conflict - 10 out of 26 provinces across the country are now directly experiencing armed conflict. This is the equivalent to 8 out of 11 dioceses suffering some form of violence. Some regions are experiencing levels of violence not seen in a decade. The situation in Kasai is new and totally unprecedented. The Dioceses of Aru and Boga have seen

displacement at a level not seen since the early 2000s. This is creating new refugees in northern Uganda which is already host to refugees from South Sudan. In the midst of the ongoing crisis, Rev. Rosalie of the Diocese of Kinshasa inspires her members from Nehemiah 2:18 to start to rebuild together and work in unity, in love and through prayer to rebuild families and communities.



The Presentation of Christ in the Temple/ Candlemas

Candlemas, 2 February, comes exactly 40 days after Christmas. In New Testament times 40 days old was an important age for a baby boy: it was when they made their first 'public appearance'. Mary, like all good Jewish mothers, went to the Temple with Jesus, her first male child - to 'present Him to the Lord'. Thus, we have the Festival of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. (Luke 2: 22-40) So where does the Candlemas bit come in? Jesus is described in the New Testament as the Light of the World, and early Christians developed the tradition of lighting many candles in celebration of this day.

A short story from the Bible


It can be read in the Bible in Joshua chapter 6 verses 1-27

Joshua led the Israelites across the river Jordan. They camped near the town of Jericho and prepared to fight.


The people in Jericho locked the town gates.




They thought they were safe.

they blew trumpets, and walked round Jericho once.




The army followed not saying a word.




They did this for 6 days.


